Over the course of the past month, we have talked about what it means to be "in the Father, through the Son, and with the Holy Spirit." We have discovered God the Father has chosen us, Jesus the Son has redeemed us, and the Holy Spirit has sealed us. We have a remarkable God who loves us and has been at work "before the foundation of the world" (Ephesians 1:4) to demonstrate his unconditional love and compassion for us.

In February, we are going to examine the human condition by looking at the bad news and the good news. The bad news tells us we are all "dead in our sins" (Ephesians 2:1) and that there is nothing we can do about it on our own. The Good News arrives with the words, "But God (2:4)." Our God is so full of grace, mercy, and love that he provided a way to rescue us from the clutches of sin and give us new life. "It is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God (Ephesians 2:8)."

In March, we will address what it means to be a church member. The apostle Paul explains how members of a church are like parts of a body (1 Corinthians 12:12). Each member brings their own gifts to the church. These gifts are what make their congregation unique. Every person at Bar Mills Community Church brings their uniqueness to our congregation, which is what makes our church special. It is by bringing yourself - all that you are - into our church family and allowing God to shape us by his love and grace, that we will begin to become a church that is building meaning through Christian community.

In his book I am a Church Member, Thom Rainer explains that church membership is not the same as a membership to a country club. Country club membership is about "receiving instead of giving, being served instead of serving, rights instead of responsibilities, and entitlement instead of sacrifice (pg. 11)." Being a member of a church means you are a part of our body of believers, and a part of the body of Christ. "Members of a church comprise the whole, and are essential parts of it. (pg 12)"

Some of you may have questions, doubts, or trepidations about church membership. I did for a long time. As we begin to explore what it means to be a member of Bar Mills Community Church, I invite you to bring your questions and uncertainties. Ask God to open your heart up to what it means for you to be a member of our congregation. Seek the ways you can use your unique self to give, serve, and sacrifice for our church, our God, and our world as we are Building Meaning through Christian Community.

Jesus Gives Us the Comforter

Theme

The Holy Spirit is our comforter.

Object

An oscillating fan and pieces of crepe streamer - one per child

Scripture

John 14:16

Parent or Teacher:

- 1. Set up a fan to move and blow over the children.
- 2. Hand each of the children a piece of streamer to hold as you talk.
- 3. Allow them to hold it up into the wind when it comes their way.

Today we are going to talk about something you can't see, but you know it's there.

Do you feel that? What is it and where is it coming from? (Allow kids to answer, but keep asking them to provide facts and proof of this wind they do not see.)

So you're convinced there is wind here even though you don't see it? We can't see the wind, but we sure see what it's doing, don't we? I see it blowing some of your streamers, some of your hair is moving, and I also feel much cooler than I did before.

Do you know what this reminds me of in the Bible? (Allow kids to guess.) I'll give you a hint: It's an amazing gift left for us when Jesus returned to heaven to be with His Father. Do you know what it is now? (Allow kids to guess.)

Jesus promised us a helper and that helper is the Holy Spirit. We don't see the Holy Spirit because He lives inside of those of us who make Jesus our Lord and Savior. But just like the wind from the fan today, even though we can't see the Holy Spirit, we know that He brings comfort and help to us.

Pray:

God, even though we can't see You, we know You are real. We also know Your Holy Spirit is real. Thank You for the comfort You bring us through the gift of Your Holy Spirit. In Jesus' name, amen.






Jesus Promises the Holy Spirit

Pastor's Report

- 1. Pastor Dave Reiss started discussion on the book "Pursuing God's Will Together" by Haley Barton with first topic being *Discernment*.
- 2. When is best time to meet to discuss the book? Decided best time is not during a Council meeting
- 3. Who should be included in the initial group?

Clerk Report - see report (accepted)

Financial Reports see reports(accepted)

- 1. It was asked if the dues for Cumberland Assoc. were paid last year.
- 2. John Myers- Financial Administrator did not receive a bill to pay the dues for last year.
- 3. Pastor Dave Reiss to respond to email he received about Assoc. from 2021.

Treasurer's Reports (see reports) - all accepted

- 1. Offerings down slightly from last year
- 2. Judy Sjulander has received the final bill for the painting project.



Here are some ways that we can serve our church and serve God.

Volunteering is a great way to feel connected to the church, feel like part of a community, and serve Jesus at the same time. There are many ways to help at church: we are always looking for help making food for the Take- Out Lunch and the Free Supper, we need help serving the meals at the Free Supper, crafters to make items for the Christmas Marketplace, join a committee and the list goes on...

Missions are a way for us to give back to God and to help provide for those struggling with difficult times locally or to donate to an organization that can spread the news of the gospel world-wide and provide help to those in need. Each month our church offers a different mission to contribute to.

Tithes and Offerings A *tithe* is a specific amount (10% of your income) that you give first, and an *offering* is anything extra that you give beyond that. After you've tithed and paid all your bills and expenses for the month, you can use any extra money in your budget to give even more! it's the lifeblood that keeps the church moving forward, a key component of good financial stewardship. It allows churches and ministries to be able to fulfill the mission, vision, and call God has placed on us. Tithing helps us grow our faith and trust that God will provide for us.



Offering Challenge

There are roughly **35 people** that attend Sunday services each week. If we all give at **least \$1** more each week that would give the church an extra **\$1820** at the end of the year.

Fundraising is one of the most important aspects of a church's success. Not only does fundraising help to ensure a church's financial viability, but it also brings community members and parishioners together for a good cause. Listed below are the ongoing fundraisers our church offers.



Clynk is a bottle drive and we are looking for your help! It is easy to participate.

1. Bag It (pick up bags at church) 2. Tag It (tags can be picked up at church)

3. **Drop It** (at any Hannaford Clynk location) In **2021** we earned **\$400**. In **2020** we earned **\$900**

Let's set the goal for 2022 to \$900 again.

Each bag contains an approx. \$3.25 worth of redeemed bottles and cans



As we write up our grocery list, let's also plan to pick up our Hannaford Gift Cards each week at church. They can be purchased after the service in the back of the church.

Gift Card Challenge

In 2021 **604** gift cards were sold = **\$1510** Let's set a goal of **800** for **2022** = **\$2000** If we sell just **7** more cards each that earns us an extra **\$910** at the end of the year.

Each \$50 gift card = \$2.50 to the church.



The **Take-Out Lunch** is the second Wednesday each month and most people donate \$10.00. Each meal includes a sandwich, a cup of soup and a dessert. You can pick up your lunch at the church or ask to have it delivered.
