#### **Committing to Community in Christ**

When I was younger, I struggled with the idea of church membership. I was an active attender, highly involved in the youth programs and served in various other areas. I thought of membership as a construct created by people that held no theological basis. It seemed as though a person became a church member to be a part of an exclusive club, giving them a position of power to flaunt over others. As I reflect on church membership now, I realize that it is much more than the joining of a club or community group.

Being a member of a local church is committing yourself to a community in Christ. By joining the church in membership, we are declaring that we commit to gathering, praying, sharing, giving, and serving together. We are responsible to each other to love, serve and encourage one another. The church is a community of imperfect people serving our perfect Savior, and supporting each other along the journey of faith.

While the term "church membership" is not found in scripture, the concept of committing yourself to a community in Christ is evident. At the end of Ephesians 2, Paul shares how we are being built together into a holy temple "with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone... for God's dwelling in the Spirit. (Ephesians 2:20-22, CSB)." I believe this metaphor of membership connects to our vision, Building Meaning through Christian Community. As a church, we are inviting Jesus to build us into Christian community being guided by his Spirit. As church members, we are committing our individual selves to being built together into that "holy temple."

In March, we will begin a sermon series on church membership. We will discuss how, as members of Bar Mills Community Church, God is building us together to comfort, grow, serve, give, workshop, and share together.

Here is the schedule for the series:

March 6: Built Together (Ephesians 2:19-22)

Church membership is being built together into God's Holy Temple

March 13: Comfort Together (2 Corinthians 1:3-7) [Caring]

Church members comfort others as they have been comforted

March 20: Grow Together (Ephesians 4: 11-6) [Discipleship]

Church members are growing together into spiritual maturity

March 27: Serve Together (Hebrews 10: 22-25) (Mission and ministry)

Church members are encouraging each other to love and serve.

April 3: Give Together (2 Corinthians 9:6-8) (Time, Talent, & Tithes)

Church members are giving cheerfully to God their time, talents, and tithes.

**April 10:** Worship Together (Psalm 100) (Palm Sunday)

Church members worship together in gladness and thankgiving

**April 17**: Sharing Together (Romans 10:9-15) (Evangelism – Easter)

Church members are sharing the good news of the resurrection

April 24: Committing Together

Wednesday Bible Studies will dive deeper into these themes. Consider joining us at 1:30 in person (at the church) or at 6:30 on Zoom.

At the end of the series, you will be invited to become a member or renew your membership in our church. The essentials for membership include being in a committed relationship with Jesus Christ, proclaiming your faith through baptism, and a commitment to being active in the life of our church. If you have not been baptized, we are hoping to have a special baptism service on April 24. If you desire to be baptized and proclaim your faith, then please reach out and let me know.

I know for some of you, there are questions and concerns about membership. Reach out to me and we can set up a time to talk about membership and your involvement at Bar Mills Community Church. It is my hope that God will use this series to strengthen and unify our congregation and prepare us for the next steps he has for our church family.

#### World Vision- The Global 6K for Water

On May 21, BMCC will be hosting a 6K (3.7 mile) walk/run. This event is a fundraiser for World Vision, a Christian organization that serves as the hands and feet of Jesus in communities around the world, working to end poverty and injustice. This run, called the Global 6k, is designed to raise money and awareness for people who have little access to clean water. Many people groups around the world must walk this distance daily to provide water for themselves and their families. This limits children's access to education and hygiene.

Two years ago, I participated in my own private 6K and invited people to support me in this cause. I woke up early to avoid the hot Texas sun and ran the allotted distance

around my neighborhood. It was a rewarding experience, but also lonely. This year, I want to invite you to join me in making a difference for people around the world.

On May 21, we will run one big circle that starts and stops at our church. This is a great activity to invite people you know to join. We will be making registration forms available at the church, or people can register online, <a href="mailto:global6k.worldvision.org/team/34313">global6k.worldvision.org/team/34313</a>. Each registration costs \$50, which goes directly to providing clean water to someone in a developing country.

If you do not feel you are able to participate physically, you can still donate to the cause or help with logistics. We will also be looking for people to coordinate the event and encourage our runners. Wanda Rounds and I have begun working on this. We plan to invite local runners and school groups to participate.

One of the powerful things about the Global 6k is that each runner will get a unique race bib with a picture of a child that can be sponsored through World Vision. These pictures are a great reminder of why we are doing this event, and give people a chance to make a difference in the lives of children around the world. The children on the bib are part of the World Vision sponsorship program, and \$39 a month can make a world of difference.

I am super excited about the opportunity we have at Bar Mills Community Church to bring hope into our world, as well as connecting with people in our own community. Please pray and see how God will use you in this event. Let's aim for 100% participation from our church family!



We are now offering two Bible Study options on Wednesdays.

Please join us each week as we gather together (in person or via Zoom) to glorify God through fellowship with one another and to study God's Word.

In March, we will address what it means to be a church member. The apostle Paul explains how members of a church are like parts of a body (1 Corinthians 12:12). Each member brings their own gifts to the church. These gifts are what make their congregation unique. Every person at Bar Mills Community Church brings their uniqueness to our congregation, which is what makes our church special. It is by bringing yourself - all that you are - into our church family and allowing God to shape us by his love and grace, that we will begin to become a church that is building meaning through Christian community.

After several conversations and prayerful consideration we unanimously voted to adopt the following policy.

"Beginning March 1<sup>st</sup>, the church masking policy is being updated. Starting March 1<sup>st</sup> we will rely on CDC guidelines for our masking policy. 
We know that masking is a delicate issue for many people. We ask that you remember others and their health needs and comfort level.
