Small Group Ministry was one of my main courses of study while in seminary, and I am excited for small groups to begin here at Bar Mills in mid-May. On **May 15**th, I will begin a new sermon series on Peter, one of my favorite people in the Bible. To accompany all of the sermons, we will have groups that meet to process Peter's journey and how we can apply his experiences to our lives. I want to encourage you all to be a part of one of our small groups. We are still working out details, and we will let you know more soon. One thing we will need are people who are willing to lead these groups. At first this may sound intimidating, but I hope it will not be. I will be providing lesson plans for the small groups with discussion questions, and so leaders will be facilitating the discussion and creating an environment where people are welcomed and accepted. May 21st is another big day for us at Bar Mills. It begins with our first Global 6K for water, our mission fundraiser. We have already raised over \$1000 for World Vision and have 18 people participating in the walk/run. I would love to see both of these numbers increase as we get closer to the event. On **May 21**st at 2:00 pm, we will celebrate the life of Don Moody. Don was a faithful member of our church and actively involved in Alcoholics Anonymous. While we miss him, we celebrate that he is with Jesus, rejoicing in heaven.

Along with everything happening in the life of our church, our family is waiting for a clear diagnosis and treatment plan for our son, Henry. Five years ago, he was diagnosed with stage four neuroblastoma and underwent an 18-month treatment plan. For over three years, he has been cancer-free, but we are rather certain that either his cancer has returned or a new cancer has started to form. The next few weeks are going to be filled with scans and doctors' visits in order to determine how to best care for him. Henry is in great spirits and we are overwhelmed by the amount of love you all have been showing him and our family. We covet your prayers during this time, and trust that God is good even in the midst of this struggle. I know we are not alone, many of you are also wrestling with your own medical issues. You are in our thoughts and prayers.

Finally, I want to thank those who have completed the Membership Commitment Form. For the past two months, we have been talking about what it means to be a church member, committing yourself to a community in Christ. For those who have not completed it, we are asking our faithful attenders to either recommit their membership if they are already members, or to join our congregation in membership. I know that for some, church membership is a complicated issue, and I do not want to pressure you, but if you consider Bar Mills Community Church your church home, I want to encourage you to commit yourself to our church community.

A new way to serve the community in the month of May!

The Bonny Eagle High School Theater students will be performing their spring musical on May 12th -14th. Our very own Lucy and Eli Reiss are a part of the cast and the rehearsals are already underway. We hope everyone can attend one of the performances!

The students, cast, and crew all stay late during the final week of rehearsals, called "Tech Week". The drama teacher, Ms. Pillsbury, has traditionally asked theater parents to provide cooked food for potluck dinners every night of Tech Week. It is a big ask - 5 nights of feeding approximately 35 hungry students! It is a lot for the theater parents to take on and a big task for the teacher to organize.

The Women's Fellowship Circle has already agreed to supply two nights' worth of meals for Tech Week. We have committed to bringing in food on Tuesday and Thursday of Tech Week (May 10th & May 12th). I have already shared this with Ms. Pillsbury and she is quite appreciative. I would like to see if we can expand our reach to one or two additional nights for Tech Week. If there's one thing, I know our church excels at, it is lovingly feeding people! If you are interested in providing a main dish, a side dish, a "snack" food, or dessert, please let me know. They typically ask for the following:

- 3 Main Dishes (12 servings each) such as pulled pork sandwiches, chili, mac & cheese, burgers, etc.
- 3 Side Dishes such as salad, fruit trays, veggies, soup, pasta salad, rolls, etc.
- 3 Snack Sides such as chips & salsa, regular chips, pretzels, etc.
- 3 Desserts such as cookies, brownies, etc.

I will be putting out a schedule in the lobby for anyone who is willing to fill this need for any of the nights of Tech Week. Our first priority is fully filling the Tuesday night slots. We will be purchasing pizza for their Thursday night meal. And if anyone is willing to fulfill further food needs for Monday, Wednesday, or Friday of that week, it would be amazing, above and beyond! I can deliver the food for you to the high school; we just need to meet up in advance.




