# Revelation 2:18-29 (CSB)

<sup>18</sup> "Write to the angel of the church in Thyatira: Thus says the Son of God, the one whose eyes are like a fiery flame and whose feet are like fine bronze: <sup>19</sup> I know your works—your love, faithfulness, service, and endurance. I know that your last works are greater than the first. <sup>20</sup> But I have this against you: You tolerate the woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess and teaches and deceives my servants to commit sexual immorality and to eat meat sacrificed to idols. <sup>21</sup> I gave her time to repent, but she does not want to repent of her sexual immorality. <sup>22</sup> Look, I will throw her into a sickbed and those who commit adultery with her into great affliction. Unless they repent of her works, <sup>23</sup> I will strike her children dead. Then all the churches will know that I am the one who examines minds and hearts, and I will give to each of you according to your works. <sup>24</sup> I say to the rest of you in Thyatira, who do not hold this teaching, who haven't known "the so-called secrets of Satan" —as they say—I am not putting any other burden on you. <sup>25</sup> Only hold on to what you have until I come. <sup>26</sup> The one who conquers and who keeps my works to the end: I will give him authority over the nations— <sup>27</sup> and he will rule them with an iron scepter; he will shatter them like pottery — <sup>28</sup> just as I have received this from my Father. I will also give him the morning star. <sup>29</sup> "Let anyone who has ears to hear listen to what the Spirit says to the churches.

# Revelation 2:18-29 (NIV)

- <sup>18</sup> "To the angel of the church in Thyatira write: These are the words of the Son of God, whose eyes are like blazing fire and whose feet are like burnished bronze. <sup>19</sup> I know your deeds, your love and faith, your service and perseverance, and that you are now doing more than you did at first.
- <sup>20</sup> Nevertheless, I have this against you: You tolerate that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophet. By her teaching she misleads my servants into sexual immorality and the eating of food sacrificed to idols. <sup>21</sup> I have given her time to repent of her immorality, but she is unwilling. <sup>22</sup> So I will cast her on a bed of suffering, and I will make those who commit adultery with her suffer intensely, unless they repent of her ways. <sup>23</sup> I will strike her children dead. Then all the churches will know that I am he who searches hearts and minds, and I will repay each of you according to your deeds.
- <sup>24</sup> Now I say to the rest of you in Thyatira, to you who do not hold to her teaching and have not learned Satan's so-called deep secrets, 'I will not impose any other burden on you, <sup>25</sup> except to hold on to what you have until I come.'
- <sup>26</sup> To the one who is victorious and does my will to the end, I will give authority over the nations—
  <sup>27</sup> that one 'will rule them with an iron scepter and will dash them to pieces like pottery' black as I have received authority from my Father. <sup>28</sup> I will also give that one the morning star. <sup>29</sup> Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

Revelation 2:18-29 (N.T. Wright's Translation)

18'Write this to the angel of the church in Thyatira. "These are the words of the son of God, whose eyes are like flaming fire and whose feet are like exquisite brass. 191 know what you have done: I know your love, your faith, your service and your patience. I know that your works have been more impressive recently than they were before. 20But I have something against you: you tolerate the woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophet and teaches my servants (in fact, deceives my servants!) to practise fornication and to eat idol-food. 21I gave her time to repent, but she had no wish to repent of her immorality. 22Look! I am going to throw her on a bed, and those who have committed fornication with her will have great distress, unless they repent of the works into which she has led them. 23I will utterly slaughter her children, and all the churches will know that I am the one who searches minds and hearts. I will give to each of you what your deeds deserve. 24For the rest of you in Thyatira, those who have not held this teaching, who haven't discovered the so-called 'satanic depths': I'm not going to put any other pressure on you. 25Just hold on tightly to what you have until I come. 26To anyone who conquers, who keeps my works right through to the end, I will give authority over the nations, 27to rule them with a rod of iron, as when clay pots get smashed! 28That is the authority I myself received from my father. What's more, I will give them the morning star. 29Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the spirit says to the churches:"

ABOUT Thyatira:
Read the selection from Discipleship on the Edge to learn about the history and culture of this city.

# Selection: Chapter 6

Thyatira was the Center for the worship of Apollo, the God of sunlight. Apollo was thought to be the divine guardian of the city. He was the patron God of many of the city's trade guilds and was regularly honored at guild functions. Thyatira was a prosperous commercial center. It was the manufacturing hub of the Roman province of Asia. It was famous for its unusual number of trade guilds. Which meant no one could possibly make it financially in the city unless they were a member of one of those guilds. Not to join a guild meant financial loss.

The people of Thyatira believed that the Roman emperor was the incarnation of Apollo. And the son of Zeus. The emperor Domitian named his son 'son of God' and on coins his son is portrayed holding seven stars.

What insights did you gain and how did it help you understand the culture in which this message was written?

#### STRUCTURE OF THE SEVEN LETTERS TO THE SEVEN CHURCHES

# QUOTE: NT Wright

The seven letters are sharp and pointed messages to the church in question, and other Christian churches already in the area, and to all churches then and now, who can listen in to what the risen Lord is saying. The letters follow the same pattern. They begin with a reminder of some aspect of the description of Jesus in chapter one. They continue by congratulating the church on what has been going well and then warning them about what has been going badly. The letters end with a warning and promise. The Spirit is speaking to the churches, calling Christians to conquer and promising them some aspect of the future the glorious future which God has in store... They are to conquer, not by fighting back, but by following Jesus, who won the victory through his own patient suffering. God's people must bear patient witness to Jesus, thereby conquering the evil forces that surround and threaten them.

The messages to the seven churches have a repeated pattern.

**Introduction:** Write to the church of....

**Jesus' Description:** Using imagery from Revelation 1, Jesus highlights a section of his character.

**Encouragement:** Jesus acknowledges what they are doing right, "I know..." **Warning:** Jesus addresses a issue with the church. "But I have this against you..."

Advice: Jesus shares how to make things right with God

**Reward:** Jesus shares the reward for remaining faithful (conquering). "To the one who conquers:"

Conclusion: "Anyone who has ears to hear listen to what the Spirit says."

# QUOTE: NT Wright

Jezebel was the gentile wife of king Ahab (1 Kings 16 to 22) who seems to have been the cause of her husband's wickedness. Jezebel seduced the Israelite men away from pure worship of Yahweh, and introduced the worship of Baal, a rival God, into Israel. This was the heart of many other evils.

What might this issue look like in our church and our lives today?

## QUOTE: Darrell Johnson

Tolerating Jezebel meant that they were tolerating a spiritual compromise. Spiritual compromise means to commit spiritual adultery, and spiritual adultery inevitably leads to spiritual sickness and eventually spiritual death. In any compromise arrangement involving Jesus Christ, in any balancing scheme, it is the relationship with Him that is shortchanged.

What does spiritual compromise look like in our lives?

# QUOTE: NT Wright

What is required at the moment, for those who have not been drawn away by the teaching and practices of 'Jezebel' is that they 'hold on tightly.' That is a word for all Christians today who find themselves in churches and fellowships where teaching and behavior which they know is not the way of the Messiah is being eagerly embraced and hailed as God-given.

What advice does Jesus give this church in order to be right with God?

What might this advice look like for our church and in our lives?

What is the reward for those who conquer and what encouragement would the first readers gain from this reward?

#### **QUOTE: Darrell Johnson**

The morning star usually appears at the darkest time of the night. It usually emerges at the point when the night is as dark as it's going to get. When it appears there is no sign of the dawn. But one it appears, very faint and small at first, you know that night cannot withstand the dawn. Jesus is saying he will especially encourage those who remain loyal to him. If we keep our eyes on him, the bright morning star, we will remember that the struggle is almost over and we will have the courage to keep following even when it seems costly to do so.

How can this reward encourage us to remain faithful and endure?
